Here's what you need to know about CCM:

- CCM gives you direct access to a care coordinator who can help you with your chronic health needs. They're available Monday through Friday during regular business hours.
- You'll get a comprehensive plan of care, which you can either access electronically or get printed out at the office.
- CCM includes help with managing your medications, like getting refills between your doctor visits.
- It also involves coordinating with services in your home or community that can help you.
- If you're transitioning between different healthcare facilities, like from the hospital to home, CCM can help with referrals and follow-up care.
- CCM services are billed to Medicare one time a month, only when services are provided.

In short, CCM is a team of people helping you manage your health, making sure you get the care you need, when you need it.
